How to find us

The nursery is situated just off the main Helston to Lizard Road (A3083) near Gweek. From Helston, pick up the A3083 which will take you past RNAS Cudrose. When you get to the roundabout, turn left (sign posted St. Keverne). You will then go down a hill and pass Travis Perkins Builders Merchants on your left. Take the next turning on the left (there is a brown sign for the National Seal Sanctuary) as you are almost to the top of the hill. (Take care as the road turns back sharply!) Carry on past the viewing enclosure for RNAS Cudrose and the nursery is on the left hand side roughly 10 metres from this turning, adjacent to the Grange Fruit Farm.

We will be able to advise when certain plants will be ready. We do propagate plants other than those listed, and also grow a small range of shrubs and seasonal plants. These may appear on sale from time to time. If you are looking for something in particular, please ask.

Very small orders may be sent by post, which could be cheaper. (Current price on application)

For deliveries on a Saturday and to the Isle of Wight, Scottish Islands & Highlands, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and Northern Ireland, different price schedules apply. Details on application. NB. We are contracted with ANC for a next day delivery service, but ANC do not guarantee this.

PERENNIALS AND BIENNIALS

ACHILLEA

Invaluable for their long flowering season from summer onwards. Yarrows are useful cut flowers and also dry well. Best in poor dry, soils and given sharp drainage through the winter to ensure they are perennial. Resent crowding out by other plants. Slug resistant but favoured by rabbits and chickens!!

clvpeolata

A variety which is raised from seed. Silver grey leaves set off the bright yellow flower heads which appear through summer. Easy to grow and very attractive in a hot, dry border. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.25**

Fanal

Flat heads of cherry red flowers in summer, on strong stems above fresh green leaves, which spread through the ground. An eye catching colour, when used with silvers and paler pinks. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.25**

Lachsschonheit (Salmon Beauty)

Soft salmon flowers over a long season. Looks good with Knautia macedonica and Pennisetum villosum in sun and well drained soil. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.25**

Lilac Beauty

A pretty shade of lilac pink that teams well with other pinks, silvers and deep purples. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **£3.25**

millefolium Colorado series

We offer the following colours which we have selected from seed and grown by division. These types do best in full sun, with sharp drainage and we have found them to be very perennial and wind resistant.

Much loved by my Pekin Bantams - to eat!

millefolium Cornish Sunrise (Colorado Apricot) *The Old Wither Garden Nursery introduction!*

We were very excited when we discovered this plant and it lives up to it's new name with deep orange buds that open to a good apricot colour that lasts for weeks, gently fading out to light brown. An unusual colour that often causes comment when customers see it planted with Potentilla 'Monarch's Velvet' and the glaucous leaves of Thalictrum glaucum flavum. - sumptuous!! Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.55**

millefolium Cornish Sunset (Colorado Brick Red) *The Old Wither Garden Nursery introduction!*

Another unusual colour. Sturdy stems hold flat heads of deep red flower buds, which open dark, like an intense winter sunset, eventually fading to brick red, with yellow middles. The flowers persist for weeks, slowly turning brown. Blue grey leaves seem to form a ruff to set off the flower colour. Strong grower. Not available early in the season. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.55**

millefolium Colorado Wine

Deep wine red buds open the same colour and are held in flat heads above deep green leaves, for months in summer. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.25**

millefolium Red Velvet

Deep wine red flowers on wiry stems through summer and early autumn. Thick green leaves carpet the ground in sun and well drained soil. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.25**

Summer Pastels Group

Earlier to flower than the Colorado series.

Salmon

Deep salmon buds the colour of smoked salmon, open to flat heads of pinkish orange flowers. Strong grower. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.25**

Terracotta

A much sought after named variety which has flat flower heads of dusky orange fading to yellow and silver grey leaves. Very popular with our customers when we planted it with Pennisetum villosum and Knautia macedonica. In flower for months, but resents being crowded out. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.25**

Walther Funke

Orange red flowers in large, flat heads over silver green leaves. Another gorgeous colour and in flower in our own garden well into Autumn. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.25**

ACORUS

Evergreen grass like plants which are excellent for permanently moist soil where they will brighten shady corners. Slow to establish, they gradually form a solid clump of stripy leaves, from the central rootstock which sits above the ground like miniature Iris rhizomes. Also useful to give colour to winter containers.

gramineus Ogon

Bright gold and green leaves. A real feature in January when you may not have much to look at in your garden! Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £2.95**

gramineus Variegatus

Green and white striped leaves. Looks beautiful in front of blue Iris siberica, creating a cool effect. Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £2.95**

AEGOPODIUM podagraria Variegatum

Much admired in the spring in our dry shade border, where it is planted under Elm trees. The plant dies down completely in winter and appears in spring, as yellow and green leaves which unfurl to white and pale green variegation. The white flowers, which are like Cow Parsley appear in early summer. Easy to grow and very tolerant of drought once established. Also suitable to colonise a shady ditch. Spreads rapidly once established! Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £3.25**

AGAPANTHUS

Popular plants for coastal gardens and large containers in full sun. Dislikes wet soil and may require protection over the winter in colder areas. Quite hardy in the milder counties and grow like weeds in some parts of Cornwall and the Scillies. The bulbs require division every few years or they will become congested and not flower so well. *Available late spring due to winter weather.*

Blue Moon

Grey blue flowers late in the season, flowering in September. Strong stems support the enormous heads.

Height: up to 100cms (40 inches) **Price: £4.95**

Jack's Blue

An evergreen variety with a dwarf habit and large flowers which are deep blue. Does very well in our own exposed garden in good soil. Height: up to 45 cms (18 inches) **Price: £4.95**

Navy Blue

Deciduous variety which has large heads of deep blue flowers on sturdy plants from midsummer onwards.

Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £4.95**

Purple Cloud

Evergreen variety which has pale green leaves that set off the purple blue flowers, deep purple in bud. These appear in late summer. Best in full sun and some shelter to flower well. Height up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £4.95**

Snowball

Sturdy grower for sun and well drained soil or a large container. Deep green leaves set off the large heads of white flowers which are produced in summer. Height: up to 75 cms (30 inches) **Price: £4.95**

Tom Thumb

Dwarf form which has small heads of soft blue flowers over a long season on established plants. Ideal for the front of a hot, sunny border or in a container. Deciduous. Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £4.75**

White Heaven

Large heads of pure white flowers from August to September on established clumps.

Height: up to 100 cms (40 inches) **Price: £4.95**

Windsor Grey

Deciduous variety which has huge heads of greyish white flowers in late summer. A tough variety which is ideal for coastal gardens or to grow in large containers. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £4.95**

ALCHEMILLA

An excellent group of plants, easily grown in most soils and situations, where they will happily seed and spread to create low maintenance areas of ground cover. Flowers are greenish yellow sprays, useful for arranging either fresh or dried.

erythropoda

We have finally managed to find a reliable seed source for this beautiful Alchemilla! A miniature of A. mollis and better behaved for the edge of a path or smaller areas. The leaves are greener than A. mollis, which is more lime in colour.

Height: up to 15 cms (6 inches) **Price: £3.25**

mollis

The ever popular 'Ladies Mantle' which will grow in most situations, from heavy clay near water to dry, sandy soil under trees or in full sun. Clouds of lime green flowers which last for weeks in a vase. Scalloped leaves look beautiful when covered in the morning dew. Easy to grow, deadhead the flowers before they seed unless you require a plantation!

ANEMONE

Japanese Windflower types

Among the most graceful flowers for late Summer and Autumn (still flowering here into November) Given sun or part shade, Windflowers are easily grown in retentive soil. Very perennial and long lived. Leaves form fresh clumps of green from early in the year, making a good foil for other plants.

x hybrida Honorine Jobert

One of the best Japanese Anemones which has glowing white flowers with a small yellow eye, held on sturdy stems.

Long flowering season from late Summer to late Autumn. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.75**

x hybrida Konigin Charlotte

An old variety with large, soft pink flowers on tall strong stems. One of the first Japanese Anemones in flower on the nursery - kindly reminding us that autumn is on the way in August! Followed by attractive seed heads.

Height: up to 120 cms (4 feet) **Price: £3.75**

x hybrida Whirlwind

A very attractive variety which has pure white, semi double flowers with twisted petals. The flowers stand well clear of the leaves on tall stems. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.75**

ANTHEMIS

Although they are not long lived and require re-planting every few years. Anthemis have a very long flowering season through Summer. They are suitable for sun and well drained soil, resenting winter wet. All make good cut flowers.

tinctoria E C Buxton

Much sought after for it's perfectly formed primrose yellow flowers and neat habit. Bronzy green leaves for the backdrop give the flowers a luminous glow. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.25**

tinctoria Sauce Hollandaise

Feathery green leaves topped with creamy white daisies through summer. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.25**

ANTHERISCUS sylvestris Ravenswing

A very dour looking plant with it's deep purple, almost black, lacy leaves. During the Summer, these are topped with flat white Cow Parsley heads of flower, making a pleasing contrast. Once it has flowered, the plant often dies away to nothing, but don't panic - it will return in Autumn and carry on growing through the Winter. For cool soil and sun or part shade. Seeds gently. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.25**

ARMERIA

'Thrift'. The wild form is a common site on the Cornish cliffs in Summer. Excellent for a Cornish hedge in full sun and well drained soil.

maritima Alba

Beautiful form which has white pom pom flowers on short, wiry stems. A change from the pink forms – tough and excellent at the front of a sunny border. Height: up to 15 cms (6 inches) **Price: £1.40 (9cm pot)**

maritima Dusseldorf Pride

Pink pom-pom heads of flowers above a neat cushion of needle like leaves. Excellent on a dry wall and in seaside gardens. Very drought tolerant once established. Height: up to 20 cms (8 inches) **Price: £1.40 (9cm pot)**

maritima Rubrifolia

Needle like deep purple leaves make a slow growing cushion. Deep pink flowers. Looks lovely in a gravel garden. Height: up to 20 cms (8 inches) **Price: £1.95 (1 litre pot)**

ARTEMESIA

A diverse group of plants, grown for their attractive leaves, from shrubs through to perennials and rock plants. All are best in sun and well drained soil.

arbrotanum

Lad's Love. We have tried for ages to get hold of this old cottage garden plant, which used to be seen in many gardens. A customer let us have a cutting and we have built up a small stock. The fresh green leaves are sweetly scented on upright plants. Inconspicuous, reddish flowers, which I prefer to take off to keep the plant bushy. For sun or part shade and most soil types. Prune by half in late spring once the new shoots appear. Deciduous. Height: up to 120 cms (4 feet) **Price: £3.45**

ludoviciana Valerie Finnis

Upright growth and strong silvery leaves make this a beautiful plant to use with other silvers and purples as well as white and yellow. Slowly spreads underground to make a clump at the front of the border. Dies down completely in winter, so prune old growth to the ground in spring. Height: up to 75 cms (30 inches) **Price: £3.55**

Powis Castle

Makes a large shrub, with fine, feathery leaves for sun and well drained soil. Prune hard in late spring, once the new growth is seen in the middle of the bush. Looks great with Papaver Patty's Plum and Purple Sage! Semi evergreen.

schmidtiana Nana

A very useful plant for the front of a dry border in full sun, where it will make lovely fluffy mounds of fine silver leaves. The plant can be pruned to the ground if it gets out of shape or after flowering and it will reshoot from the bare wood. We have it planted in our own garden between Box balls with dwarf Narcissus. Deciduous.

Height: up to 20 cms (8 inches) **Price: £3.25**

vulgaris Oriental Limelight

Forms an upright clump of lime, green and yellow leaves, topped with straw like flower heads. Looks lovely planted in a border with other yellows, as a foil to flowering perennials. May spread rapidly underground. Semi evergreen.

ARUNCUS

Similar to Astilbe but the Goat's Beards are suitable for drier soil and full sun. Pretty leaves which colour well in Autumn before dying away.

aethusifolius

Miniature plant for the front of the border in sun or part shade and most soil types. The attractive cut leaves make good ground cover and in Summer and early Autumn, small white flower spikes appear. Good Autumn colour before the plant dies down. Height: up to 20 cms (8 inches) **Price: £3.55**

dioicus Kneffii

Late to appear in the spring, but well worth the wait! Finely cut, lacy leaves are very attractive in their own right and are topped with arching sprays of creamy white flowers in summer. A beautiful plant for sun or part shade.

Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.95**

ASTER

Michaelmas Daisies. Easily grown in retentive soil, in sun or part shade. All make good cut flowers.

Prune old wood to the ground in Spring, after the birds have eaten the seeds through the Winter.

Coombe Fishacre

A beautiful hybrid which flowers for weeks in early Autumn, with dusky pink daisies which have brown middles. The plant branches horizontally and has small leaves. May require staking. Height: up to 120 cms (4 feet) **Price: £3.25**

ASTER (continued)

Cornish Clouds

This Aster is a chance seedling which was growing in one of our demonstration beds for a couple of years. Customers would remark on it and ask it's name and if we were going to offer it for sale. We finally dug it up and split the plant down, moving it to our stock plant area, where it sat for another year, still nameless, completely neglected and dried out in the summer! Unlike many Asters, it seemed to be quite mildew resistant and flowered it's socks off last autumn, so we took pity on it and will have it for sale this season. Cornish Clouds appears to be a cross between A. Little Carlow and a novi-belgii cultivar. The flowers are the same handsome blue as Little Carlow, semi double, prolific but a few shades paler, with the darker eye. The novi-belgii parent has made the plant very compact and free flowering.

divaricatus

One of my favourite Asters, with clouds of small white flowers held on almost black, wiry stems in late Summer, freshening the borders when they are often taking a breather before the Autumn show. Requires staking, or can be allowed to flop over a host shrub or path. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.25**

ericoides Cinderella

Wiry stems and twiggy growth which requires no support. Long lasting plumes of tiny, greyish white daisies, with yellow centres. A good plant for a prairie border or natural planting. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.25**

ericoides Pink Cloud

Smoky pink flowers, which last for weeks during early Autumn, smothering the plant. Small leaves and twiggy growth which is self supporting. An easy colour to place in the garden. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price £3.25**

frikartii Monch

Sought after form of Aster which has a long flowering period from the middle of August. Rounded leaves and large blue flowers with yellow centres. For sun and soil which is not too wet in winter. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.55**

lateriflorus Lady in Black

Narrow, deep purple leaves set off the small, greyish pink flowers which smother the upright plants in late summer and early autumn. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.25**

Little Carlow (cordifolius hybrid)

A real stunner with true blue flowers and dark middles. Tends to flop so give it a shrub to wander through or stake it. Good with silvers and greys. In flower from late Summer onwards. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.25**

novi- angliae Andenken an Alma Potschke

Narrow fresh green leaves, make a compact cushion for the luminous magenta pink flowers - a whacky colour to brighten any grey autumn days! Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.25**

novi-angliae Purple Dome

A beautiful form which has semi double, very dark, inky purple flowers on compact plants. An unusual colour. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.25**

novi - belgii Chatterbox

Ruffled, pale pink flowers on sturdy stems in autumn. Height: up to 45 cms (18 inches) **Price: £3.25**

novi - belgii Fellowship

Tall grower with double, pale pink flowers above healthy deep green leaves. Height: up to 100 cms (40 inches) **Price: £3.25**

novi - belgii Heinz Richard

Deep cerise pink, double flowers in September and October. Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £3.25**

novi - belgii Kristina

Dwarf form with greyish white flowers that smother the plants in September and October. Makes a low mound for the front of the border. Prune old shoots to the ground after flowering. Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £3.25**

novi - belgii Lady in Blue

Double powder blue flowers. For the front of the border and windy sites. Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £3.25**

novi - belgii Little Pink Beauty

Dwarf form which is late flowering into October. Double, bright pink flowers. Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £3.25**

novi - belgii Marie Ballard

One of our favourite tall Asters, with clear blue, semi double flowers for weeks in autumn. Deep green leaves on sturdy, upright growth set off the picture. Very pretty for the middle of a border. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.25**

novi - belgii Porzellan

A taller variety with strong stems which are wind resistant. The fully double flowers, which appear in September, are an unusual colour, opening sky blue and fading to lavender grey. Beautiful. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.25**

novi - belgii Winston S Churchill

An old favourite and with good reason! Deep reddish purple, ruffled flowers with yellow centres on strong stems. The flowers clothe the stems in late September and are excellent as a cut flower - especially for Harvest Festival arrangements. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.25**

AUBRETIA Royale Series

Ever popular plant for walls and rock gardens. The plants are smothered with brightly coloured flowers in Spring and early Summer. Best in sun and well drained soil. We offer two strains – Blue which is a soft mauve and Red, a deep magenta purple. Cut back hard after the first flowering and you are often rewarded with a second crop. Guard against slugs in early spring.

Height: up to 15 cms (6 inches) **Price: £1.55 (1 litre pot)**

BERGENIA

Elephant's Ears. Large, leathery evergreen leaves, making good ground cover in most soils and situations. Useful for dry shade and in exposed conditions. Salt and wind resistant.

Autumn Magic

Large green leaves colour to red during colder weather. The bright pink clusters of flowers appear in autumn and again in spring if the weather is not too unkind. Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £3.55**

Eroica

A newer variety with fresh green leaves and deep pink / magenta flower clusters in spring and also in autumn. The plants leaves take on beautiful red and bronze tints through winter. Very attractive and vigorous.

Harzkristall

Bright, glossy green leaves make a good foil to this pure white flowered form. Compact grower which flowers from late spring to early summer. Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £3.55**

BRUNNERA

The Perennial Forget Me Nots are, I think, much underrated. They are easy to grow in shade and dry soil, where their large leaves will make a good, ground covering clump. In late spring, clusters of tiny flowers appear on the ends of trailing stems. The more shady the situation, the larger the leaves will grow to capture more of the light!

macrophylla Betty Bowring

Deep green leaves and white flowers in sprays through spring and into summer. Lovely with pink late Tulips on the edge of a shady border. Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £4.95**

macrophylla Dawson's White

Beautiful variety with large white leaves margined with green. Grow in full shade to prevent scorching. Relishes dry soil. Sprays of blue flowers in spring. Height: up to 45 cms (18 inches) **Price: £4.25**

macrophylla Looking Glass

A new introduction which has completely silver leaves with a narrow green rim. The same blue flowers in spring. Best grown in deep shade to prevent the leaves from scorching in sunlight. Lights up the spring garden.

Height: up to 45 cms (18 inches) **Price: £4.95**

CALTHA palustris

Marsh Marigold. Often found in the wild growing in wet places and on the edge of streams. Glossy green, rounded leaves make a solid crown and the single, bright gold flowers appear in clusters on the ends of fleshy stems in late spring and early summer. Attractive spiky seed heads follow. Seeds gently if it likes your garden and the ground is wet enough. Best in permanent moisture and some shade. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.55**

CAMPANULA

A useful family of easily grown perennials, suitable for most conditions. All fit well with the cottage garden and flower in Summer unless otherwise stated. Guard young growth against slugs.

latiloba Hidcote Amethyst

Evergreen rosettes of long, narrow leaves form good ground cover in most soils and situations. The cup shaped, lilac pink flowers are very beautiful and appear along the length of stiff, upright stems at mid Summer. Spreading very well in one of our borders at the nursery, in quite heavy clay soil, enriched with mushroom compost. Young plants may not flower in their first year after division. Useful for shade. Height: up to 75 cms (30 inches) **Price: £3.55**

takesimana

Another large flowered Campanula with greyish white bells on lax stems. The insides of the flowers are hairy and spotted with red. Unexciting, nettle like leaves make good ground cover. I am no flower arranger, but these are excellent in a vase on their own! Height: up to 75 cms (30 inches) **Price: £3.55**

CENTAUREA

I never fail to be amazed by this group of plants. They seem to put up with the most exposed of situations, including right on the coast, as well as our exposed front garden. They are long lived and easy in well drained soil and sun. Attractive to butterflies.

dealbata

A pretty plant for the wild garden, with spiky greyish leaves which have silvery undersides. The flowers are deep pink and appear throughout Summer from scaly, pale brown buds. In flower well into autumn.

Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £2.95**

macrocephala

A dramatic plant for the back of a border. Coarse, pale green leaves form a clump and during the Summer, the furry brown buds push up on strong stems, and open into large, golden yellow Cornflowers. In flower for months. The spent flower heads are good for drying or autumn border decoration! Height: up to 120 cms (4 feet) **Price: £2.95**

montana

A pretty cottage garden plant which is very old, but often difficult to find! A mass of silver grey leaves form a slowly spreading clump. Blue flowers, like large cornflowers are borne for a long period from March onwards. A good plant for chalky soils. We can never grow enough! Height: up to 45 cms (18 inches) **Price: £3.25**

phrygia

Coarse sage green leaves make an upright plant. Bright pink cornflowers appear over a long season from curious 'wig like' buds. Take care when dead heading that you don't cut off the buds by mistake!

ruber Albus

Pure white flower spikes above pale green leaves. Looks lovely with Alchemilla mollis in a sunny border.

Members of the Scabious family, but much more robust! Best in sun and good, moisture retentive soil. Cephalaria die back to a central crown in the winter. Much loved by bees and butterflies, who cling to the flowers as they waft in the breeze atop wiry stems.

Pale yellow flowers for months in Summer on compact plants. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.95**

gigantea

This plant causes a lot of comment when our customers see it planted out at the nursery. Our plant is in part shade and dryish soil, but towered above everything else last Summer. Nick and I have three plants in our exposed front garden at St Martin and they were in flower for months last year - a beautiful site through the lounge window! Deep brown pointed buds open to luminous lime green and then to deep primrose Scabious flowers, held well above the leaves on strong stems. May seed gently. leucantha

A smaller plant than C. gigantea but beautiful growing through other things. Smaller greyish white flowers borne in the same profusion on long stems. Seeds gently in our own garden. Looks lovely with Verbena bonariensis.

CONVOLVULUS sabatius

The flat blue flowers smother the plants for months in summer and are shown off by rounded, silvery grey leaves. Excellent plant for coastal locations, where it is very salt resistant. The varieties that we offer are not invasive like the orange variety, which is a garden escape found growing on cliffs in milder parts of the country!

Carmine Brilliant

A dainty variety which has large, open flowers that are red and orange, produced along wiry stems in late summer.

DAHLIA

Useful for late colour in mixed borders, the dark leaved varieties act as a foil for other plants earlier in the season. Plant on top of grit to sharpen the drainage under the tubers. Best in sun and retentive soil. Watch out for slugs when the new growth starts to appear in Spring. Bednall Beauty

Very similar to D. Bishop of Llandaff, with dark leaves and red flowers, but on dwarf plants, making it ideal for pots on the terrace! Height: up to 45 cms (18 inches) **Price: £3.55**

Bishop of Llandaff

Famous Dahlia which always causes comment. The shiny leaves are very dark maroon and set off the single red flowers, which appear from shiny buds over a long period through Summer and into Autumn. A compact grower.

Essential cottage garden plants for sun and well drained soil. Dianthus require lime in the soil, so add some if your garden is neutral or acid. We plant ours with their roots on grit, because of our heavy soil. This prolongs their life but they do resent winter wet. Evergreen silver leaves form a spreading mat. We will have a range of dwarf and taller, hybrid varieties for sale from late spring onwards. Dwarf varieties are suitable for terracotta pots, rock gardens and the front of sunny borders by paths, where the scent can be enjoyed, whereas the taller hybrid Pinks are more suited to the middle of the border or cutting garden. DIASCIA rigescens

A beautiful plant which is hardier than the bedding types. We had a plant in a sunny border whilst living in Kent and it was never harmed in the Winters there, although it has fared worse during the last two here in Cornwall! Evergreen leaves on square stems, some of which trail along the ground whilst others remain upright. The soft pink flowers are produced in whorls at the tips of these stems throughout the Summer until the first frosts. A real value for money plant for the front of a sunny border and well drained soil. We can never grow enough!! Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.25**

DIERAMA

'Angel's Fishing Rods' The plants that we offer are grown from seed and take three years to reach flowering size. They are variable in colour and height, being seedlings. We hope to hang on to some of the plants long enough to see them flower, but our customers seem happy to surprise themselves! Evergreen and do best in sun and rich, retentive soil, that is not waterlogged in Winter. Another good plant to give height in exposed positions. Dieramas will expand widthways each year and seed gently if they like your garden. *Available late summer.*

dracomontanum

Low growing Dierama which has grassy grey green leaves, quickly making a big clump. Red flowers appear on established plants at midsummer. Height: up to 45 cms (18 inches) **Price: £3.95**

pulcherrimum

An exquisite plant with grass like leaves which form a vase shape. During the Summer, the flower stems push upwards, with buds which look like tissue paper. These unfold into bells which are various shades of pink and dangle along the upper lengths of the stem held, it seems, by invisible cotton. If it is windy they will get tangled up together and if I see them like this, I have to waste time untangling them so that they hang straight again!!

Foxgloves add a strong vertical accent to the border. We offer types suitable for shade and sun. Please see under individual varieties for preferred conditions.

grandiflora

An evergreen, perennial Foxglove for sun or part shade and most soil types, but not too wet. Narrow leaves make a ground hugging rosette and the sturdy stems unfurl their primrose yellow flowers which have maroon spots in the tubes. Beautiful with old Roses and other summer flowering perennials. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £2.95**

lutea

A quiet plant suitable for part shade and soil which is not too dry in summer. Narrow leaves make a rosette and the slender stems bear small, pale yellow flowers in late spring and early summer. A beautiful plant for the edge of a shady area near a path where the flowers can be appreciated. Height: up to 75cms (30 inches) **Price: £2.95**

x mertonensis

Beautiful Foxglove for sun or part shade and soil which is not too dry. Large, deep green leaves are evergreen and make a handsome clump. Brookside

Similar to Johnson's Blue, with as long a flowering season but deeper blue flowers with a pretty white 'eye'. Easy to grow in most situations and soil types. Flowers for months if cut back to the ground after each flush.

Although this was one of the first purple Poppies, it is still very sought after, and an extremely good doer. The plant makes a clump of pale green, hairy leaves in most soil types and sun. Huge buds appear in the heart of the plants and slowly rise up on sturdy stems, before opening in mid summer to deep plum with black markings on the petals. Limited quantities only as we can never produce enough! Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.95**

Princess Victoria Louise

Large flowers of salmon pink above clumps of jagged green leaves, on compact plants.

A good old hardy variety, with deep green narrow leaves. Small, tubular flowers of dark red are borne freely through summer and into autumn. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.75**

Blackbird

Tall grower which has very dark, mucky purple flowers with white veins in the throats. Very dark purple in bud, which increases its appeal if like me, you are into dark plants! Good wind resistance, but may require staking.

Auriculas flower mainly in the spring, but with care and deadheading, they will reward sporadically throughout the year, until the frosts.

Deep purple flowers for months through late spring and summer. Very pretty and a reliable variety.

Height: up to 20 cms (8 inches) **Price: £1.30**

riviniana Purpurea Group

A charming form of miniature Violet which is a true perennial. The rounded purple leaves make the perfect foil for the tiny violet flowers, which appear in late Spring and early Summer. Excellent for under planting shrubs or old Roses. Seeds freely but you will be loathed to pull them up! Height: up to 20 cms (8 inches) **Price: £1.45 1L pot**

ZANTEDESCHIA *Harmful if eaten / skin + eye irritant*

Arum Lily. Best in moist or wet soil. Well known for their showy flowers which are produced over a long season. Although evergreen, the plants are easily frosted to the ground (even in Cornwall!) but recover from the rootstock. Leave the damaged growth on the plants, although it looks messy and this will protect the crowns until they start to grow away again. **Limited quantities due to winter losses**

aethiopica

White flowers with a yellow centre from late spring onwards. Best in some shade and moist soil, but we have seen them growing and seeding almost everywhere. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.55**

Green Goddess

Large triangular leaves of olive green. The spear shaped flower buds unfurl to pure white flowers that look as if they have been painted deep green on the edges. For sun or shade and wet soil on the edge of a bog.

Height: up to 120 cms (4 feet) **Price: £3.75**

GRASSES

The grasses can be found on a separate sales bed on the nursery, but we continue to use them in our mixed displays to give ideas for planting. Grasses add texture and often, late interest to mixed borders. Very popular and low maintenance, many are wind and salt resistant too.

AMPELODESMOS mauritanicus *Available in summer*

Rope Grass. Unusual grass with evergreen leaves, similar to Pampas Grass, but maintain their gloss through the Winter. The one sided, buff flowers appear on the ends of pendulous stems from early Summer onwards. My mother has one in her gravel bed and I cannot remember when it was last without flowers! We have planted one in our front garden and it stands the salt wind and gales without a mark. Requires well drained soil and a sunny site. May require protection during the Winter.

Height: up to 300 cms (9 feet) **Price: £2.95**

ARUNDO

Giant Reed. A source of reeds for wind instruments and originating in the Mediterranean. Arundo require moist soil and may spread rapidly in warmer parts of the country.

donax

Upright growth, with grey green leaves that make a statement on the edge of a large pond or bog garden. The flowers are large plumes of pinkish grey, fading out to brown. They appear in autumn after a warm summer. The whole plant stays evergreen in milder areas and should be pruned to the ground in spring. Height: up to 550 cms (18 feet) **Price: £4.95**

donax var. versicolor

Leaves are striped with cream and white, the white being brightest in spring and becoming creamy yellow as the season progresses. Shyer to flower than A. donax. Height: up to 420 cms (14 feet) **Price: £5.95**

CALAMAGROSTIS

Attractive grasses which form arching mounds in most soils and situations, but not too wet. Especially useful to give height in shady areas.

arundinacea (STIPA arundinacea)

A beautiful, evergreen grass which will tolerate very deep shade. The leaves are a colour wash of reddish yellow and give beautiful tints in Autumn. An excellent subject for a container, where the leaves can arch over and it will be happy for a couple of years. Best in soil which does not get too wet during the Winter. Height: up to 120 cms (4 feet) **Price: £3.25**

brachytricha

A beautiful grass for late colour when the thick, bushy plumes of greyish purple are covered in morning dew. During the growing season, the plant makes an arching mound of greenish purple leaves. The flowers appear on tall stems well above the leaves. Height: up to 120cms (4 feet) **Price: £3.25**

x acutiflora Overdam

For moist soil in sun or part shade. Quickly makes arching mounds of green and white variegated leaves, topped with purple, feathery plumes of flowers in late Summer. The new growth is flushed pink and this grass can be cut down once or twice in a season to keep the colour. Pretty with Cephalaria gigantea. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.55**

CAREX

Sedges. A diverse group of grasses which are useful to give movement and texture to planting. Grasses also make very good container plants - especially several pots grouped together.

elata Aurea

Bowles Golden Sedge is a very beautiful grass with green and gold striped leaves, which arch over with age. Needs moist shade and looks especially effective near water. Grows well in very heavy clay. Shear to the ground in January to maintain the new brighter growths. Height: up to 45 cms (18 inches) **Price: £4.25**

testacea

More upright growth than C. comans. Thin, pale green leaves which have bronze tints in Spring and Summer, deepening to orange through Winter. Useful at the front of a sunny border or in a container. Evergreen.

Height: up to 45 cms (18 inches) **Price: £3.55**

DESCHAMPSIA

Tough grasses for sun or shade and most soil types. Attractive feathery flower heads on established plants for months from early summer onwards. The flowers bleach out to gold and buff and provide valuable winter colour and seed for birds.

caespitosa

Deep green leaves quickly form an impenetrable clump. Purple flowers are held on tall stems from early summer onwards. Very pretty with Heucheras, Berginias and other bold leaved plants for autumn colour.

Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £2.95**

flexuosa

Useful evergreen grass for sun and most soil types. Needle like deep green, glossy leaves make a compact mound. During the second year, fine deep purple flower heads appear well above the mounds of leaves. Very pretty and unusual.

ELYMUS magellanicus

For sun and well drained soil. The narrow, aluminium coloured leaves make a clump, spreading underground and flowering in late summer. Evergreen. Height: up to 45 cms (18 inches) **Price: £3.55**

LEYMUS arenarius

A pretty steel blue grass which is best grown in a pot unless you have plenty of room, or chop chunks out to stop it spreading too fast!! The grey blue 'wheats' appear during the Summer. Looks lovely behind pink Sedums. Bleaches out to pale straw in Winter. Prune to the ground in January. Needs well drained soil and sun. Height: up to 150 cms (5 feet) **Price: £2.95**

MILIUM effusum Aureum

A beautiful grass to grow in shade where it will brighten dull corners. The leaves are flat, wide and golden yellow. The flowers are borne in the Summer on the ends of fine stems. They are like tiny beads. Looks lovely in woodland with Corydalis. Seeds gently. Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £2.95**

MISCANTHUS

Very popular group of grasses for most soil types except very dry, in sun or part shade. We have several varieties in our stock beds, which are very heavy, but fertile clay. They are thriving. The flowers appear in late Summer and Autumn, bleaching out and remaining on the plants until the wind strips them off (well, in Cornwall anyway!). They are like feather dusters in dusky purple and silver. We cut ours down in late Winter, before the new growth starts.

Purpurascens

A compact grower which has pink flower spikes that fade to silver, at the end of the summer. Good autumn tints of red and orange. Height: up to 150 cms (5 feet) **Price: £4.25**

sinensis Ferner Osten (Far East)

Upright growth of reddish green leaves which colour more intensely in autumn. Redd flowers appear from the end of the summer and last well into winter. Height: up to 120 cms (4 feet) **Price: £4.25**

sinensis Graziella

Deep green leaves make an upright, vase shaped plant, topped in late summer and autumn with silver plumes, which fade to beige through winter. Good autumn colours of red and orange. Height: up to 180 cms (6 feet) **Price: £4.25**

sinensis Hinjo

Pale green and yellow striped leaves make a very attractive clump in a mixed border or large container. Silver flowers in late summer. More compact than M. sinensis Zebrinus. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £4.25**

sinensis Kaskade

Green leaves make an upright clump and the silvery flowers are borne well above the clumps in summer. Height: up to 180 cms (6 feet) **Price: £4.25**

sinensis Malepartus

Beautiful grass for sun or part shade and soil which is not too dry. Wide, deep green leaves cascade softly and the magnificent flower plumes appear in early September. They open silver and become fluffy and white when dried. Leaves turn gold and orange in autumn. Height: up to 210 cms (7 feet) **Price: £4.25**

sinensis Morning Light

Narrow, grey and green variegated leaves make an upright clump for the middle of a sunny border in soil which is not too dry in summer. Dusky, purple flower plumes appear in late summer and autumn, bleaching out and persisting through the winter. Height: up to 120 cms (4 feet) **Price: £4.25**

sinensis Zebrinus

Tall grass with narrow leaves, banded with white in the Summer. Makes a loose, arching clump. Lilac purple plumes of flowers in late Summer and Autumn. Height: up to 240 cms (8 feet) **Price: £4.25**

MOLINIA

A useful group of grasses for most soils and situations. The feathery flowers are very pretty in Summer and many varieties have good Autumn colour. The plants die right down in Winter.

arundinacea Karl Foerster

Deep green leaves which form an arching clump in sun or part shade and soil which is not too dry. Reddish flower spikes on tall, upright stems in late summer. The whole plant turns yellow in autumn. Height: up to 210 cms (7 feet) **Price: £3.75**

caerulea ssp. caerulea Variegata

A beautiful grass for shade and moist soil. The leaves form a tight clump and are green and cream. The buff flowers appear in Autumn, held well above the leaves. Height: up to 45 cms (18 inches) **Price: £2.95**

caerulea Moorhexe

Upright growth of deep green leaves. In late summer and autumn the flowers appear. They are deep purple on short stems. The whole plant bleaches out to straw colour during autumn. Height: up to 100 cms (40 inches) **Price: £3.75**

caerulea Skyracer

This grass caused a lot of comment when we planted it at the nursery in an exposed situation. It did so well that Nick and I planted some in our own, even more exposed garden at St. Martin and it stands up to all the winds there. Very narrow, upright growth of mid green leaves. The spiky flower stems appear in late summer and the whole plant bleaches out to straw through the winter. Height: up to 240 cms (8 feet) **Price: £3.75**

PENNISETUM

Beautiful grasses which may require protection during the winter in colder areas. They will seed if they like your garden and grow best in sun and well drained soil. The leaves are quite coarse, forming dense, slow spreading clumps. Late to appear in Spring.

alopecuroides Hameln

Narrow, deep green leaves quickly form an upright clump. The flowers are bronze brown and open to reveal purple anthers. Flowers from the end of Summer, well into Autumn. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £3.55**

alopecuroides var. viridescens

Broad, deep green leaves and thick stems which produce fat spikes of purplish flowers at the end of hot summers. An attractive grass which has an arching habit. Give it full sun to encourage flowering. Prune gently in spring.

Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.25**

macrourum Not available due to winter losses

Narrow leaves make an upright, vase shaped plant of graceful habit. Slender brown flowers in late summer and autumn, which bleach out to straw colours and are held on the plants through the winter. Height: up to 120 cms (4 feet) **Price: £3.25**

orientale

The flowers are held well above the leaves on upright stems. They are fat and furry with a pinkish cast and appear throughout late summer and into autumn. For full sun and well drained soil. We have some planted in our garden at St Martin and they were stunning last summer, having taken three years to settle in! Remove old dead growth in spring, but don't cut to the ground. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £2.95**

villosum

Fresh green leaves, forming a low mound. Ideal for exposed positions in sun and well drained soil. The flowers are earlier than P. orientale and are even fatter and furrer! We have it planted with Knautia macedonica and they compliment each other perfectly. Height: up to 30 cms (1 foot) **Price: £3.25**

PHALARIS

Ribbon Grass or Gardeners Garters. A very conspicuous grass in the Summer with it's green and white leaves.

arundinacea var. Feesev

An upright grass which has pale green and white leaves topped with loose panicles of buff flowers in late summer. Prune hard to the ground after flowering to help contain the plants vigour. Height: up to 100cms (40 inches) **Price: £2.95**

arundinacea var. picta Picta

Looks lovely planted behind purple leaved shrubs, where the green, white and pink flushed leaves stand out. Cut to the ground in Spring before the new shoots appear and again, after the buff flower plumes in Summer. Will grow in most situations. May spread quickly. Height: up to 90 cms (3 feet) **Price: £2.95**

STIPA

Another fine group of grasses which are becoming very popular. Although many are quite tall, they flex in the wind and do not break like some plants. This makes them ideal for exposed gardens.

gigantea

Beautiful when grown as a specimen in a border or large container. The leaves are needle like and form an upright clump. Through Summer and in to Autumn, the plant pushes out long stems which unfurl to reveal golden oats, which seem to float above the leaves. Well drained soil and sun. Height: up to 180cms (6 feet) **Price: £3.75**

tenuissima

For sun and well drained soil, where it forms thick clumps of upright growth. The fresh young leaves are needle thin and fade to pale straw as they get older. Fine heads of feathery flowers in late summer. Seeds easily, so be on your guard!

Use some of these new plants to replace the parents after a few years. Height: up to 60 cms (2 feet) **Price: £3.25**

UNCINIA uncinata Rubra

Evergreen grass for sun and well drained soil or a container. Low growing, with an arching habit. The flowers are inconspicuous reddish brown seed heads and appear in Summer. Good at the front of the border or in a gravel garden.

CLIMBING AND WALL PLANTS

We are growing on a small range of the more traditional climbers. This list is not exhaustive, but will give an idea of some of the varieties available in small quantities at certain times of the year.

HEDERA canariensis Gloire de Marengo

Handsome Ivy for shade and soil which is not too wet in winter. We have a plant in our own garden, where it is making great strides to cover a patch of Cornish hedge behind a Fatsia in a dry border. Large, evergreen leaves of deep green and white held on red stems. Very tough and wind tolerant once established. Moderate grower. Self clinging. **Price: £5.55**

JASMINUM

Jasmines are easily grown in sun and soil which is not too wet in Winter. Excellent on an arch or a wall near the house. Prune out some of the old growth to tidy the plant in Spring. Twiners.

nudiflorum

Winter flowering Jasmine. Suitable for a north facing wall, where it will slowly cover a large area. Flat, clear yellow flowers, which are unscented, appear on the naked green twigs from November through to the end of February. A beautiful addition to the garden for winter colour. Slow to establish. Requires support. **Price: £4.55**

officinale

Clusters of scented, white tubular flowers throughout Summer. Pretty ferny leaves which drop in the Autumn, to reveal green stems through the Winter. **Price: £5.55**

x stephanense

Pale, lime green leaves on vigorous trailing stems. Tiny, deep pink flowers appear through the Summer. For a warm wall. Requires support. Deciduous. **Price: £5.55**

LONICERA

Honeysuckle fits well with the Cottage Garden and is easy to grow in any soil which does not get too dry in Summer. Prune back long shoots to tidy the plants in Autumn. Twiners.

Honey Baby

Deciduous variety for sun or part shade. Leaves have a reddish grey tint which sets off the scented creamy yellow flowers that appear through summer. Easy to grow and also suitable for a large container. Vigorous. **Price: £5.55**

japonica Cream Cascade

Vigorous variety which is semi evergreen and has small, cream flowers over a long season in summer. They are highly scented and borne in profusion. **Price: £5.55**

japonica Halliana

Vigorous variety, suitable for covering out houses, trees and large walls. The flowers are highly scented, pale yellow clusters and appear in Summer over a long season. Semi evergreen. **Price: £5.55**

japonica Repens

Vigorous grower for almost all situations. Deep bronze purple leaves set off the small, red and white flowers which are highly scented, and appear through summer. Semi evergreen. Ideal to cover a fence or large pergola. **Price: £5.55**

periclymenum Belgica

Purple green leaves set off the scented flowers which are rosy red and yellow, appearing in profusion in May and June. Deciduous. **Price: £5.55**

periclymenum Graham Thomas

Sage green leaves and highly scented yellow flowers in Summer. Vigorous grower for an arch or to grow through a tree. Sun or part shade. We have a plant in our own, exposed garden and it is very successful. Deciduous. **Price: £5.55**

periclymenum Serotina

Late Dutch Honeysuckle. Scented, deep red and cream flowers from midsummer to September. Moderate grower, ideal for an arch or fence. Prune in early spring to tidy. Deciduous. **Price: £5.55**

x heckrotii Goldflame

A beautiful Honeysuckle which has slightly scented flowers in summer. They are lipstick red in bud and open to a vibrant deep orange, slowly fading to cream. The leaves are a glaucous blue green, setting the flowers off to perfection. Best in full sun and deep, rich soil. Deciduous. **Price: £5.55**

x tellmanniana

Beautiful Honeysuckle for sun and soil which is not too dry. Blue green leaves set off the unscented, deep orange flowers which appear over a long season in Summer. Suitable for a sunny wall or arch. Deciduous. **Price: £5.55**

PARTHENOCISSUS

Well known self clinging Virginia Creepers for sun or shade and most soil types. Parthenocissus seem to do well in Cornwall on old walls. Beautiful autumn colours of orange and red before the leaves fall in autumn.

henryana

Beautiful variety to grow through a tree or large shrub rather than on a wall or fence. Palmate leaves are deep green and have a conspicuous silver midrib. Slow grower which colours richly to red in autumn. Twining growth. **Price: £5.55**

quinquefolia

'Virginia Creeper'. Self clinging climber which is excellent for a tall wall or house. Leaves are a rich green and colour to orange and scarlet. Easy to grow in sun or part shade. Fast growing once established. **Price: £5.55**

PASSIFLORA caerulea

Passion Flower. A twining climber which is easy to grow in sun and well drained soil. Beautiful, waxy flowers of white, with blue stamens and anthers appear through the summer. Can be very vigorous on a sheltered, sunny wall, so hack it back in spring like my mother does! Semi evergreen. **Price: £5.55**

POLYGONUM baldschuanicum

Russian Vine. Love it or hate it (and I do!) this plant has it's place to cover old trees or unsightly out buildings. Extremely quick growing in most soils and situations, where it will smother with olive green leaves and panicles of pale pink and white flowers, which appear in summer. Good autumn colour of red and orange. **Price: £5.55**

PLANTS FOR DIFFERENT SITUATIONS AND USES.

In response to lots of customer questions on planting for certain aspects, we have produced the following suggestions. Please note the word suggestions, as there are no hard and fast rules for gardening and plants will often bend them to prove you wrong!

For dry shade

Make sure that you do not let new planting go short of water until it is established - even in shady conditions. A good soak twice a week should be enough to get them established, but try to plant in spring or autumn rather than in hot weather.

For dry soil in full sun

It is recommended that you water plants well until they are established in dry borders. Give your plants a good soak a couple of times each week for about a month and then they should look after themselves. It's a good idea to water the hole well before planting, especially if the weather is very dry. Try to get these difficult sites planted either in spring or early autumn when there is more chance of rain to settle them in!
